retrieve is getting better, although she does like to play with it every once in a while! She is also at the early stages of learning the emergency button, where she is learning to move from nose to paw touch on the laminated yellow circle. Soon, we will move her onto the emergency button itself!



Rosie is growing up really fast now and her confidence grows along with her size! She is very well socialised with other dogs and people, and can be very energetic! We are currently working on her settling down around people. Her recalls and heelings are also slowly improving with each outing we go on.
