

Australian Lions Hearing Dogs continues to grow at an extraordinary rate, and along with that comes the development of new roles and

programs. Our Bed and Breakfast program has been running for almost a year and has helped us mitigate the restrictions set by the current facility capacity at the Training Centre. Now, we can continue each dog's training progress without waiting for a kennel space to open up.

Additionally, we are working on the new Psychiatric Assistance Dog Program, partnering with the Department of Veteran's Affairs to support returned service men and women with PTSD. Our team has also expanded, with a Head Veterinarian joining us, providing vital health and wellbeing support to our Breeding, Puppy and Training Program. This will assist us providing quality care for the growing number of puppies and dogs in our programs.

The Breeding Centre has recently welcomed two litters of beautiful puppies; Border Terriers and Labradoodles with amazing futures ahead of them. On top of that, we have two new fresh faces in our Puppy Team. Both members are experienced in animal handling and can't wait to bring their knowledge into the program. Our decision to foster puppies had been a spontaneous one. When our 17 year old dog passed, we wanted to get another family dog, though we weren't sure what breed to get. It was during then that one of my friends, who was a foster carer for Australian Lions Hearing Dogs, came into mind. That's how we became foster carers for Jem - who is now a Hearing Dog in training - and Eddie, our current foster pup!

We have family members who are diabetic or partially deaf, and fostering has since become our way of supporting and giving back to the community.

Eddie and Jem both fit great into our family, although it was a bit eye opening at first having a foster pup around; puppies can be very different to a 17 year old dog after all! However, after a while, it's almost like having a home dog. The benefits is having help from Australian Lions Hearing Dogs' puppy team whenever we need, of course!





Both Eddie and Jem are smart cookies, picking up their trainings really fast. Eddie in particular is very food-orientated and would do anything for treats, even if it meant stopping in the middle of his playtime! During our sessions in Puppy Preschool, Eddie would be so excited to perform tricks, he would sit and paw at me to give him commands, so he could do his tricks and get his treats!

At home, Eddie loves following me around the house in his downtime. When he's not flinging his favourite toy - a string of fluffy sausages - around, he would be settling by my feet; a quality befitting of a future Assistance Dog!

The kids adore having Eddie - as well as Jem - part of the family. They absolutely love the foster pups, and while it was hard when Jem had to leave to start his training, they knew he had to start his official training eventually and were prepared; that was how Eddie came along!

Recently, Eddie went on his first bushwalk with the family. Soon, we will take him camping and maybe even kayaking!

MEDICAL ALERT DOG PROGRAM





Mimi is the newest kid on the block! Since joining, Mimi has settled in nicely, already making new kennel friends as well as rekindling relationships with her siblings!


Due to her high energy and quick learning, it was decided she would fit right in with the Medical Alert Program. So far, she's proving to be a good fit!

Mimi is currently learning the three tasks that will help assist her recipient in the household to manage their condition. These tasks are the Hypokit Retrieve, Emergency Button and the 'Get Help' command.

She can also now alert with a one paw touch. This is a more deliberate action when alerting her recipient to low or high Blood Glucose Levels (BGL) event, this is because it is more obvious than than a two paw touch which can be confused for the dog jumping on their recipient out of excitement.

She particularly enjoys the Hypokit Retrieve as it's almost like a game of fetch! Mimi is working on fetching it from a short distance right now, but soon she will try going around the corner for an extra challenge.

Mimi has also now been introduced to a BGL scent. Soon, she will learn to alert whenever she smells a low BGL event!



LEONIE'S DELIVERY WEEK

What a week Leonie had! She started off the delivery week with VIP treatment on the plane, where she was the first to enter and leave. She was even assigned the window seat, settling on the floor by Trainer Carly's feet on her mat throughout the flight.

Once they arrived at Leonie's new home, Leonie was quick to greet both her recipient and their partner, almost like she had known them in a previous life! She walked straight in and made herself right at home.

Despite being in a new environment, Leonie adapted immediately and on the first night, alerted for the first time to a high BGL at 12.8! This was excellent news as Leonie clearly has no problem transitioning her skills onto her recipient. For the rest of the week, Leonie performed all her tasks well and also visited places that her recipient regularly frequents.

It was a sad time for Trainer Carly to leave on Friday; however, Leonie is very much loved by her recipient and we know she will make a real change to their life! Coda was born alongside his siblings to Cocker Spaniel mum, Betty, last year. Since then, Coda has experienced so much and grown into an amazing dog.

Currently, he is in training with Trainer Sarah, who he knows very well and has bonded with due to their time spent together when Sarah was a Puppy Socialisation Instructor.

Coda is a very confident and energetic dog; nothing seems to ever phase him and he's always up for a new experience. Sarah recalled their first walk together near the Training Centre. They went over a hill and bridge, came across all kinds of wildlife, and Coda was relaxed while on lead the whole time.

He recently had his first mini demo with some Lions members at the Training Centre. Coda performed admirably, surprising Sarah when he did the sounds like a pro, not needing any prompts at all. It was like he had done it a thousand times!

Now, Coda is starting to venture into large indoor public spaces locally, including Burnside Shopping Village, Norwood Parade and Big W, taking everything in his stride. Soon, he will head to Marion Shopping Centre and Rundle Mall, as well as trying his paws on the public transport.

Coda's sound training has been going great. He loves our friendly neighbourhood cats, Penelope and Pants, though always works past them when he's in focus mode. At the moment, Coda still get excited when he works, so Sarah is working on calming him down. Coda's favourite training is the bed touch. He flies on the bed just to 'wake' Sarah up! His sound training with the smoke alarm has been improving, soon he will be touch-alerting and dropping instantly.

When Coda isn't in training, he is resting by Sarah's side. He particularly likes to nap sitting by her leg while she works away on her computer! He also adores a game of fetch and would never say no to some pats and attention.

Sarah has learned so much having Coda as her first dogin-training. Coda will certainly be missed once he gets delivered at the end of October. However, the journey will be exciting as he will be going on his first ever flight interstate!
